

Every four years or "quadrennial" the global United Methodist Church meets to make decisions regarding our denomination. Each Conference (regional area) around the world sends delegates (equal clergy and lay) and their Bishop. The Bishops have voice, but no vote. There are 864 delegates who will be attending General Conference in Portland, Oregon from May 10 - 20, 2016.

As United Methodists we are called to pray for our Bishops and the delegates of General Conference. 60 days of prayer began the Monday after Easter. I encourage you to "jump in" to this effort now, even though it is late. You can go to http://60daysofprayer.org/ to register for an email or text prayer guide with scripture to be delivered to your inbox each day until 10 days after General Conference. During the days of General Conference the scripture text and devotion are written by the Bishop preaching that day. So not only are you praying for the Bishop preaching that day, you are also praying over the same scripture all of the delegates are hearing proclaimed that day.

On Saturday April 23rd from 9:30 to 11:30 am, Hilton UMC will be one of six sites for the Genesee Valley District Day of Prayer for General Conference. We will have the opportunity to make a prayer bead for a delegate to General Conference and take a prayer bead for your own prayer time.

CROP Walk 2016

The Hilton Parma Community Council of Churches will again be sponsoring the 2016 Hilton CROP Walk.

When CROP began in 1947 (under the wing of Church World Service, which was founded in 1946), CROP was an acronym for the Christian Rural Overseas Program. Its primary mission was to help Midwest farm families to share their grain with hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia.

Today, we have outgrown the acronym but we retain it as the historic name of the program. CROP Hunger Walks are interfaith hunger education and fundraising events sponsored by Church World Service and organized by CWS local offices across the U.S.

The Hilton CROP Walk is scheduled for Sunday, May 1. Registration will begin at 1PM, with the walk kick-off beginning at 1:15. This year participants can participate in a 1-mile walk. We would also welcome those who would prefer to "roll" (with strollers or wheelchairs) the route. Another option is to "rock" in rocking chairs during the walk.

If you are not able to participate in the walk, we would encourage you to sponsor someone who is rocking, rolling, or walking! 25% of the total proceeds go to the Hilton Parma Emergency Food Shelf! Our goal is 10 walkers, rollers or rockers from each organization and we are aiming to raise \$5000.

<u>Cadet Cupboard Summer Extension Program</u>

Following Christ, Connecting Generations, Transforming Communities

<u>Why</u>: A growing number of our Hilton School District children are dependent on Free and Reduced Lunch Programs during the course of the school year. Unfortunately, many Hilton District staff report that children come in on Monday not having eaten adequately over the weekend.

As the summer months approach, these children are at risk of being further food compromised. While Monroe County does provide some Summer Lunch Programs, living in a rural community makes access to these supports very difficult.

Who: A partnership between the Hilton Central School District and HUMC.

<u>What</u>: The Cadet Cupboard Program, which runs through the school year, provides atrisk students supplemental food in their book bags on a Friday afternoon to provide assistance until they return to school on Monday. We are seeking to extend this Program to cover the summer months.

Approximately 15 families have been identified by the Hilton School District's Elementary or Middle School Administrators or Guidance Offices as in need of food assistance over the summer. Hilton District has contacted these families individually and they all have agreed to partner with HUMC.

When: June 23-Sept 1 (Total of 11 weeks)

Where: Supplemental food boxes will be made available either through pick up (at HUMC) or delivery on a weekly basis.

Hilton United Methodist Church 2016 Guidelines for Cadet Cupboard Summer Program

Thank you for helping to support the children in our community. Below are guidelines for the purchasing of items each week. Some items are required as noted below.

Required items:

- 1 gallon 2% milk (unless they request whole or skim milk)
- ½ gallon of 100% juice (no high fructose corn syrup)
- 1 loaf of bread
- 1 dozen eggs may be available through the church
- 2 child friendly cereals that are healthy such as Cheerios, Raisin Bran, Mini Wheats... Oatmeal is also great if the children like it
- Starch item ie: potatoes, rice, pasta, macaroni and cheese. There should be enough for at least two meals
- Fruit 2 cans or fresh fruit if possible
- Vegetables 2 cans or fresh veggies if possible
- Canned meat ie: tuna, chicken, pork & beans enough for one meal for the entire family
- Granola or cereal bars that are child friendly (healthier bars)
- 2 paper products ie: toilet paper, paper towel, Kleenex

Other suggestions:

- Pasta sauce
- Peanut butter
- Pancake mix
- Soup
- Dish soap, hand soap, laundry detergent

The total cost of items should be less than \$30. We may be able to supplement with donations from grocery stores, farmers and local providers.
